Using the work of Frank Lloyd Winght as the central focus, this unit explores the fundamentals of architecture and the language of building design. Winght's work is explored through texts and videos (YouTube). Students complete a plueprint, using appropriate symbols, and then construct a model of their "dream house." This unit allows students to create in both 2.8.3 dimensional formats. Originally developed as an upper elementary lesson, this can easily be adapted for older students.
