SMITH WALBRIDGE CLINICS- DRILL DESIGN WORKSHOP

July 10th-12th, 2015

Rationale- Describe how this event aligns with the approved ISBE Outcomes and Type of Professional Development identified above.

Outcomes marked:

1. Deepen Educator's Content Knowledge.

Music educators are often responsible for a marching band. Many of these individuals in the state are responsible for creating what is called "drill" for their marching band. Drill is the motion that one sees on the field when a marching band performs. Learning to write, understand, and teach drill is essential for any director. It is accomplished through experience with computer programs, careful planning, knowledge of procedures, and creative thought. The Drill Writing Workshop increases the knowledge of the art and science of learning to write drill with an intensive 2 ½ day event. The instructors from both collegiate and high school drill writing backgrounds use the program Pyware to teach program basics, advanced techniques, creative design, effective music/drill sequencing, and effective teaching techniques for drill that has been created. This program directly affects the content knowledge of the participant in the area of music.

2. Improve learning of students.

By learning to create effective drill that will work within their given band, and learning how to more effectively teach this drill to individuals, student learning will improve. When a director can create their own drill, they know it well, understand the intentions for the students, and better communicate those intentions/effects to the learning population. Students can ask questions that the instructor can directly answer, and communication about the show and performance is improved because the teacher is directly involved in the teaching content. By increasing the educator's knowledge, student learning is improved.


3. Provide educators with the knowledge and skills to collaborate.

The drill design workshop is taught in a lab type setting. Participants share ideas and prior experiences with one another, learning from successes and fails with the software, artistic design, and student learning. By enhancing the participant's knowledge and skills in the area of drill writing, they are better able to communicate with other music educators in their school, district, and across the state about improving student learning in music and performance. The clinic is a model for this type of outreach and communication regarding drill creation and implementation.

Type of professional development marked:

1. Engage participants over a sustained period of time allowing for analysis, discovery, and application as they relate to student learning, social or emotional achievement, or well-being.

The drill design workshop takes place over 2 ½ days. Participants will increase their knowledge and skills in the area of drill design, creation, and implementation with the students in their classroom. They analyze the drill of their instructors, peers, and themselves to learn from errors and successes. They learn how to better navigate the computer program Pyware to make teaching drill more streamlined and effective for student learning. Finally, directors can apply what they have learned to their own music and drill in their own show, receive assistive support from the event instructors, and have a great start to their fall show with their students! Our clinic and instructors are wonderful, very talented, and love to teach!
